Flu Season Precautions

Respiratory illnesses are on the rise this year, including the Flu (influenza), which is contagious. The CDC urges individuals to take the following measures to protect vourself and others from the flu:

- Get the flu vaccine each year for all persons 6 months of age and older  $\Rightarrow$
- Avoid any close contact with sick people  $\Rightarrow$
- $\Rightarrow$ Avoid touching your eyes, nose and mouth
- Cover your nose and mouth with a paper towel when coughing or sneezing  $\Rightarrow$ (use elbow if no paper towel available)
- Wash your hands frequently (with soap and water) and  $\Rightarrow$
- Clean and sanitize the surfaces and objects that may be contaminated with the flu  $\Rightarrow$
