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Family Engagement Celebrates Women's History Month

Recognizing Cathie Rebelo, CVTE Director



As we are coming to an end on Women's History Month, the Family Engagement Center would like to highlight an inspirational woman to celebrate. The story of Ms. Cathie Rebelo is not only an encouraging one, but an inspirational display of what a female can accomplish!

Growing up in upper Michigan where jobs were limited, a young Cathie Rebelo struggled to find employment after high school. Luckily enough, Ms. Rebelo was exposed to welding at a young age because of her Dad. Ms. Rebelo remembers the words that the boys from school had told her that eventually became her motivation, "Welding is too hard for a girl." Those words alone gave Ms. Rebelo the motivation to continue to perfect her craft as a female welder.

During her high school years, Ms. Rebelo attended the local Skills Center as a junior and became a certified pipe welder upon graduation. With only two female welders in the classroom, Ms. Rebelo stated that her teachers were very accepting and supportive of her desire to continue to pursue a career in welding. Ms. Rebelo had a natural talent, even placing gold in the regional VICA, what we now know as SkillsUSA. Ms. Rebel had competed against over 130 male students!

After 12 years in the field, Ms. Rebelo was asked if she would be interested in joining the Metal Fabrication Program Advisory Committee at Diman Regional Vocational Technical High School in Fall River. Becoming a welding teacher was a logical next step for her. She was eager to teach and support students in their education just as her teachers had done for her. Her belief in high quality technical education was the impetus to move into an administrative role. Ms. Rebelo absolutely loves watching students blossom from incoming exploratory students to finding their niche and growing into skilled tradespeople with credentials in hand ready to go out and conquer the world! Ms. Rebelo stated how fortunate we are in Massachusetts to be able to offer technical programs to students throughout high school.

As we know, females entering a male dominated field is not easy. Ms. Rebelo's advice for female students that look to enter these fields and pave the way for future girls is to "Follow your heart and don't let anyone stand in your way! You have all that you need to get there. Stand tall and be proud of who you are, and always remember, your education is something no one can ever take away from you."

I am honored to say, Ms. Rebelo is still changing the way the trades are viewed as she is leading the way as the CVTE Director here at GNBVT. Ms. Rebelo has been a great addition to our school and continues to support our students to become the best they can be not only in their lives, but in their trades as well! I would like to personally thank Ms. Rebelo for the road she paved by showing people just how much a female can accomplish once we focus on a goal. ~ Veronica Arruda

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From the Health Office

Attention parents/guardians of our sophomore class, Year of Graduation 2025:

The MA Department of Public Health requires proof of meningococcal vaccination for students entering Grade 11. According to this regulation, all students should receive a booster on or after their 16th birthday.

We ask that you provide proof of this immunization by turning in an updated immunization record prior to returning next school year or once your child has turned 16 years old (during the school year).

Please forward the required paperwork attention to the school nurse.

We thank you in advance for helping us maintain compliance with this MA Department of Public Health mandate. Please reach out to your child's physician if you need an appointment to ensure that your child's immunizations are up to date, including their meningococcal vaccination.
